Latest Parish Council minutes

These notes have been written by the newsletter editor from the draft minutes and may be incomplete or amended at a later date.

Old Buckenham Parish Council met

on Thursday 6 June at Old Buckenham Village Hall. Those present were Councillors Naomi Bailey (Chair), Lesley Evison, Pete Twissell, Stan Burton, Ali McWilliam, Doug Irons and Steve Gowers. David Taylor arrived part way through the meeting. Also attending were John Hicks (Clerk) and four members of the public. The minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 11 April were approved (5 in favour, 2 abstain). *Financial matters.* The Community Account balance presently stood at £26,069.04. Payments of £4776.15 were approved (6 in favour) and were made up of: Community car drivers £165.20 Grass cutting £446 Clerk's salary £375.25 and Suggitts £3780.

Councillors' reports. Pete Twissell said that the damaged areas of the Green will be repaired this month. David Tranmer was invited to the meeting but was unable to attend due to ill health.

The Clerk has reported that the instruction banners for Two Wheel Tuesdays are being made and being donated by a local company who wish to remain unnamed. Martin Lambert are willing to donate some used road cones and traffic banners to help ease the parking issues on a Tuesday evening. The clerk to collect with the trailer before the end of the month. Councillors asked about payments for TWT. The clerk informed them that he agreed to delay the first payment due to the poor weather that has had an effect on the event but is to speak with David Tranmer to ensure payments are caught up. Naomi Baily had a meeting with Steve Askew, George Freeman and representatives from Banham parish council regarding the local flooding issues. George Freeman was to lobby parliament to try and find a solution but this is now on hold as parliament is being dissolved due to the election. Naomi Bailey will press for this action to restart once we have an elected MP, whoever that will be. Pete Twissell also reported that that the Village Hall Management Committee members thought their joint meeting was a success and Graham Dye will attend the next Parish Council meeting.



Hill in Staxford. She was a teacher at Bunwell school.

After the war Westfields sold fireworks. As these were in short supply you were limited to how many they would let you have. I remember there were only a few sparklers, a Catherine wheel, a jumping jack, one banger, a rocket and a roman candle. These were kept together in a box and taken out regularly to look at. I couldn't wait for November 5th as these were my first fireworks. Talking of bonfire night I remember one year throwing a load of conkers on the fire and the next year there was a conker tree growing in the potatoes. I planted it the garden at Staxford where it still proudly stands today.

Note that I still say Staxford. Why is it now Stacksford on the signposts? It has always been Staxford in my mind as it is over the front door at Staxford Villa.

I still have so many happy

memories of living with Mum and Dad at Staxford and can still reflect on those times when visiting our daughter and family living there now.

before he left.

The committee started on its 'Walk' of the hall. The secretary stated that the object of the exercise was to create a Handbook for present and future members of the committee to acquaint them with the workings of the hall. He thought it would be good practice to take new members of the committee on the 'Walk'.

Members were led from the Memorial Hall, to the kitchen and lobby, the loft stairs, through the stage corridor to the storage room, main hall, kitchen, chair store, toilets, cleaner's store, office and cloak room, pointing out salient features and appliances. This was found to be instructive to members and the Village Hall Handbook would be updated following the additions that were mentioned. The main meeting then started. The Minutes of the last meeting were agreed and signed by the acting chairperson. The call for recruits to the committee and more use of the bottle banks had been included in the village newsletter. Old **Buckenham Players committee** would be asked about storing paint in their shed at the meeting next week. The trolley under the stage had been checked and found to be empty and so available for storage. An online conversation had been

held with CAN about the next step towards Incorporation which involved the transfer of Village Hall property to the new CIO. The review of the Health and Safety policy will be deferred to October, the date when its review was finalised last year.

With regard to incorporation, a solicitor had been contacted to carry out the property transfer which may take some time as the Charity Commission has a backlog. It was also noted that we had started to earn interest on our bank account. For the performance of Elephant on Friday 14 June the hall would run the bar, the raffle and will cover front of house duties. Lucie from the Old School Bookshop will help publicise the event and bring a display of books to the evening. Members were invited to pick up fliers and publicise the event as much as possible. The Writing Workshop would be publicised on Facebook. The payment of the water bill was delayed as the treasurer had not received the invoice. After negotiations with White Rod over repairing the car park surface, they recommended stripping and retarmacing the two lanes in need of repair rather than patching potholes. The committee agreed unanimously to go ahead with this.

An Elephant in the Village Hall

A review by one of our readers: Touring theatre company fEast brought their new play 'Elephant' to a packed OB Village Hall on the evening of Friday 14 June and, like the proverbial elephant in the room, there were a good many secrets the characters in the play were deliberately avoiding. The play itself was a bit of a cliffhanger, set in a house balanced on an eroding cliff in North Norfolk. Local recluse Manny gets a surprise visit from his estranged sister, Jessie, whom he's not seen for a year. She's wildly unpredictable, searching for a long lost family secret, and has inexplicably brought along with her a petty criminal, Lee Farrier, trussed up in a sack. Jessie describes an unlucky series of events that have conspired to her making such a poor and rash decision, but Manny's believing none of it. She's done this kind of thing before.

As a rising tide eats away at the

foundations, it's the sudden appearance of a local girl, Cally, arriving with a damaged reputation and an uncanny ability to read minds, that forces all four of them to try and salvage something from the day before it's too late. But as time runs out, and the uneasy truce turns towards possible violence, a hastily reckless plan begins to fall apart, exposing the bitter truths that have brought them together, the lies they've told each other, and against all expectation, the discovery of a strangely redemptive power that might just be buried beneath their feet.

The acting throughout was superb, the story engaging (if a bit crazy at times!) and without giving a spoiler, the ending was pure gold. The play is still touring Norfolk until the end of June so you may be too late to see it at the moment. But it if you get the chance to see it in the future you won't be disappointed.

Become an Old Buckenham community car driver

Community Car Scheme

The Parish Council have agreed to support the following Community Car Scheme to offer transport to villagers for medical appointments.

Would you like to volunteer to be a driver? The drivers need to meet the following conditions:

- a) All vehicles must be taxed and have a current MOT
- b) All drivers hold a valid driving license
- c) Have a biennial CRB check (no cost to driver)
- d) A three-year medical by a General Practitioner (cost reimbursed in full by Breckland Council)
- e) Have full comprehensive insurance and letter confirming that this applies whilst driving as a Community Car Driver

These requirements are to protect both passengers and drivers.

The reimbursement is divided between the passenger paying 50% of the journey with Breckland Council and Parish Council paying the other 50%. The passenger fee is paid direct to the driver with the other 50% paid to the driver by the Parish Council monthly by cheque. Monthly returns should go to the Parish Clerk/RFO.

There is a set fee paid by the passenger going to the N&N Hospital and to Attleborough Surgeries, other destinations are calculated on mileage. (At present the passenger pays just under £10 for a return trip to the NNUH and below £2 to go to and return from Attleborough Surgeries.)
